### E. Teaching Areas:

- 1) Latin Unseen: The course includes a philological analysis of Latin prose texts with particular attention to issues of grammar, syntax and translation techniques.
- 2) Latin Prose: The course includes an introduction to Roman oratory/ rhetoric and a reading of selected passages from the theoretical treatise *De oratore* and Cicero's rhetorical speech *Pro Milone*.
- 3) Vergil's *Aeneid*: The course consists of a close reading of selected extracts from the *Aeneid*, paying special attention to the literary and historical contexts and discussing themes such as intertextuality and narrative structure.

4) Roman Historiography: Close reading of a selection drawn on prose authors, such as Caesar, Nepos, Sallustius, Livius, Pompeius Trogus, Tacitus, Suetonius and Ammianus Marcellinus. The course aims to function as an introduction to historiography – biography as distinct genres, by means of a reading of selected passages.
